**1: Annora Draper** - New Name & New Device

*Per bend vert and argent, a compass star sable.*

Submitter desires a feminine name.

Language (English) most important.

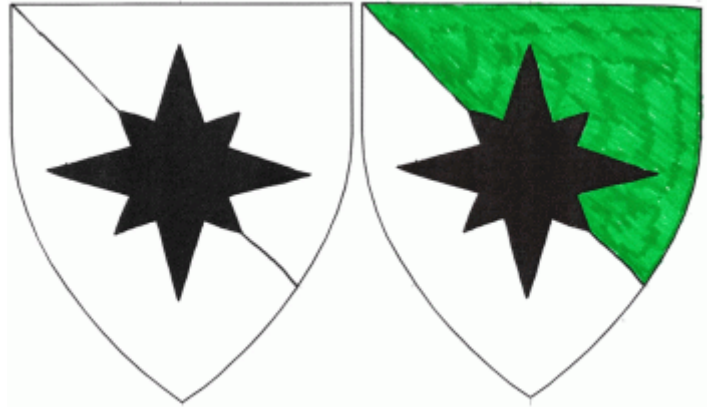
Culture (English) most important.

**Annora** - Talan Gwynek, "Feminine Given Names in A Dictionary of English Surnames: Part Two: The Names A-G" [<http://heraldry.sca.org/heraldry/laurel/reaneyAG.html>] dates the submitted spelling to 1187-1215, 13<sup>o</sup>, 1273, 1302 and 1316.

**Draper** - Aryanhwy merch Catmael, "12th & 13th Century English Textile Surnames"

[<http://heraldry.sca.org/names/english/textile.html>] gives the origin of the name as "from Old French *drapier* 'maker or seller of woollen cloth'" and dates the submitted spelling to 1232, 1235, 1240, 1248, 1250, 1255, 1260, 1262, 1270 and 1278.

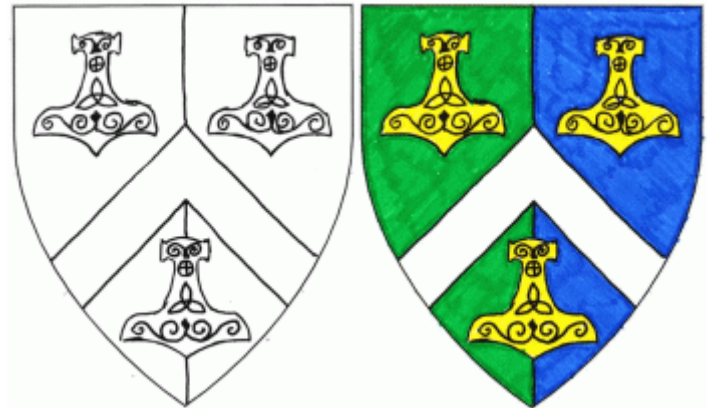
**2: Rígnach inghean uí Chonail** - New Device Change

OSCAR finds the name registered exactly as it appears in March of 2008, via Æthelmearc.

*Per pale vert and azure, a chevron argent between three Thor's hammers Or.*

Old Item: *Old item: Per pale vert and azure, a chevron between three Thor's hammers argent.*, to be released.

**3: Ulrich von Baden - New Device Change**

OSCAR finds the name registered exactly as it appears in February of 2007, via Æthelmearc.

*Or, on a fess sable between two bars gules a bar argent.*

Old Item: *Sable, a chevron throughout Or mullety sable and in base a spear entwined by a serpent Or.*, to be retained.

In support of charging a fess with a bar, the submitter provides:

"European Rolls of Arms of the Thirteenth Century"

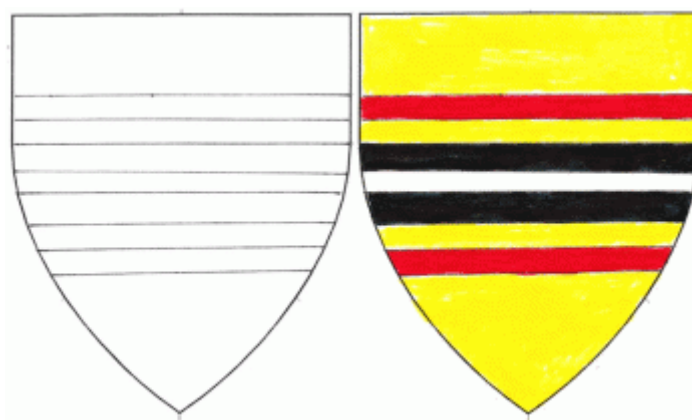

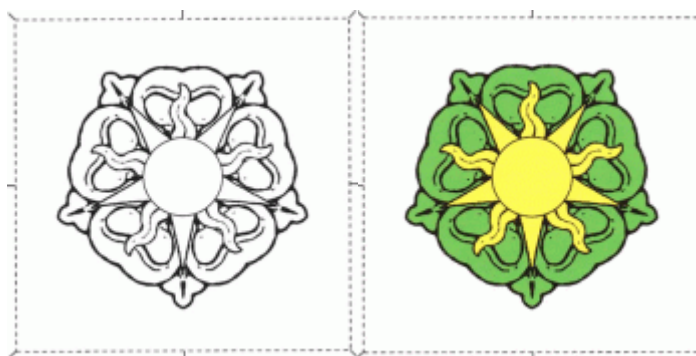
