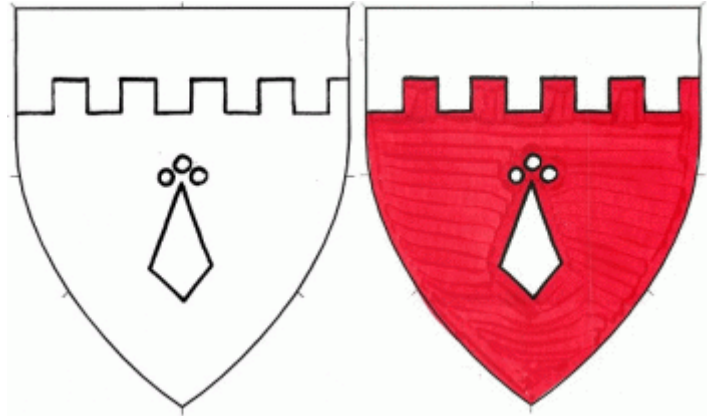
1: Alethea Cowle - New Device

OSCAR finds the name on the Æthelmearc LoI of May 01, 2010 as submitted.

Gules, an ermine spot and a chief embattled argent

Name on our XLOI of 1 May, 2010.

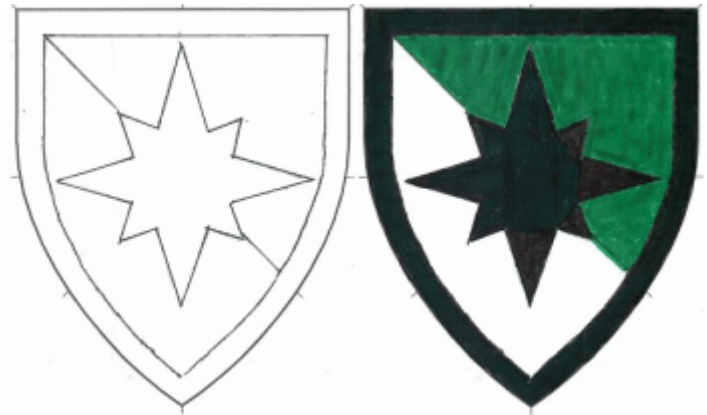
2: Annora Draper - New Device

OSCAR finds the name registered exactly as it appears in December of 2009, via Æthelmearc.

Per bend vert and argent, a compass star and a bordure sable

Her previous submission, *Per bend vert and argent, a compass star sable*, was returned at Kingdom in August, 2009, for conflict with Melissande Aefensterra (reg. 06/1986 via the West), *Chevronelly vert and argent, a mullet of eight points, alternately straight and wavy, sable*, and with Craig of the Glyn (reg. 09/1990 via Caid), *Gyronny gules and Or, a compass star sable (for Wythfed Ffordd House)*.

3: Eiríkr inn hávi - New Name Change From Holding Name & New Device Change

Gyronny Or and vert, a bear rampant contourny sable within a bordure sable seme of descrescents Or

Old Item: *Edward of Smoking Rocks*, to be released.

Old Item: *Per bend Or and vert, a beer stein and a bear rampant contourny counterchanged*, to be released.

Submitter desires a masculine name.

No major changes.

Eiríkr - Geirr Bassi Haraldsson, *Old Norse Name*, p. 9.

Sara L Uckelman (Aryanhwy merch Catmael), *Viking Names found in the Landnámabok*

<<http://www.ellipsis.cx/~liana/names/norse/landnamabok.html>>, cites this name as appearing 12 times in the *Landnámabok*.

inn hávi - Sara L. Uckelman (Aryanhwy merch Catmael), *Viking Bynames found in the Landnámabok*,

<<http://www.ellipsis.cx/~liana/names/norse/vikbynames.html>> cites this byname, meaning "tall, impressive" as being found 4 times in the *Landnámabok*.

His current device, *Per bend Or and vert, a beer stein and a bear rampant contourny counterchanged* was registered under this holding name, in September, 2005, via the East. It will be released if the new submission is registered.

**4: Eleanora de Rosewycke** - New Name & New Device

Purpure, a chalice argent and in chief three roses argent barbed and seeded Or

Submitter desires a feminine name.

Language (English) most important.

Eleanora - Brian M. Scott (Talan Gwynek), *Feminine Names in a Dictionary of English Surnames* <<http://www.s-gabriel.org/names/talan/reaney/reanyintro.html>> sub

Eleanor <<http://www.s-gabriel.org/names/talan/reaney/reany.cgi?Eleanor>> dates the submitted spelling to 1205 and 1207 via Withycombe.

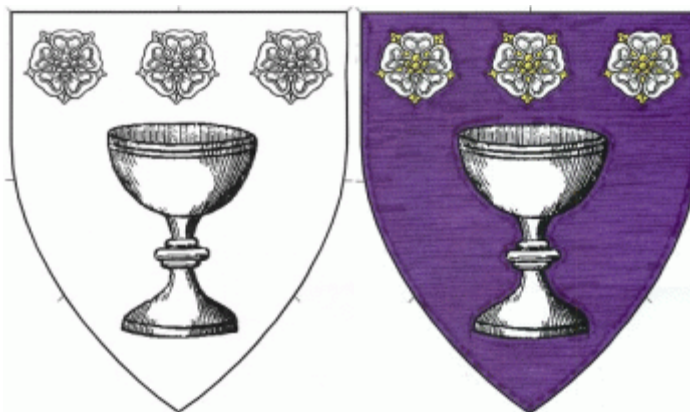
Rosewycke - W. Boxer Mayne, *The Parishes and Churches*

of S. Grade, S. Ruan Major, and S. Run Minor (in Meneage Cornwall) (London: William Pollard, 1905), p. 25 states:

Older registers than that of Bishop Bronescombe, the twelfth Bishop of Exeter, who was consecrated in 1257, do not now exist. In this register mention is made of a certain priest being instituted Rector "Ecclesie Sancte Crucis de Rosewycke," this reference very evidently pointing to some now forgotten dedication of the Church "within the manor of Rosewycke" to the Holy Cross

With reference to the construction of the name, the submitter offers (Sara L. Uckelman (Aryanhwy merch Catmael) *Index of Names in the 1292 Subsidy Roll of London: Surnames* <<http://www.ellipsis.cx/~liana/names/english/surlondon1292.html>>, which gives numerous examples of locative bynames, in the form <given name> + de + <placename>.

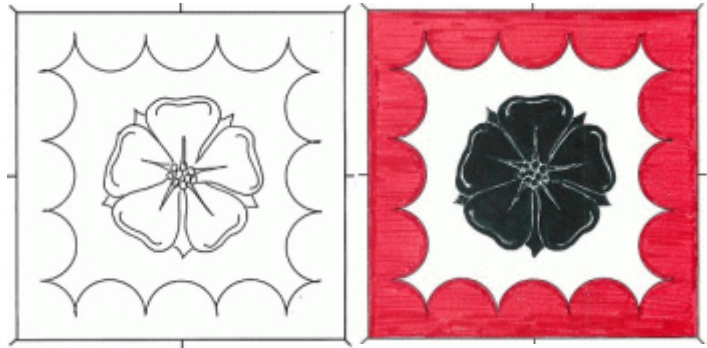
5: Günther Schwarzrose - New Badge

OSCAR finds the name registered exactly as it appears in May of 2002, via Æthelmearc.

Argent, a rose sable within a bordure (engrailed?) gules

The form does not have "engrailed" in the blazon, but engraving is clearly shown on the emblazon.

**6: Jacqueline de Molieres** - New Device

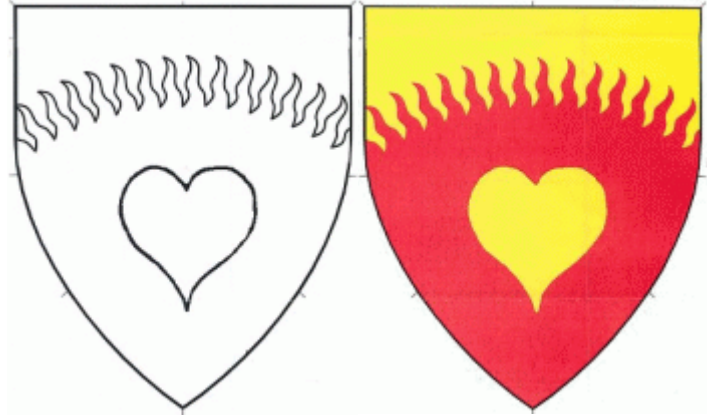
OSCAR is unable to find the name, either registered or submitted.

Gules, a heart and a chief rayonny enarched Or

Name registered, April, 2010.

I'd like opinions on the chief rayonny enarched and its acceptability.

**7: Katheryn Täntzel** - New Name

Submitter desires a feminine name.
Sound most important.

Katheryn - Sara L. Uckelman (Aryanhwy mercy Catmael), *German Names from 1495* <<http://www.ellipsis.cx/~liana/names/german/german1495.html>>, sub Katherina, cites 1 reference to this spelling.

Täntzel - Sara L. Uckelman (Aryanhwy mercy Catmael), *German Names from 1495: Surnames* <<http://www.ellipsis.cx/~liana/names/german/surnames1495t-z.html>> cites this surname as occurring once in Pollingen.

8: Maureen of Abhainn Ciach Ghlais - New Name & New Device

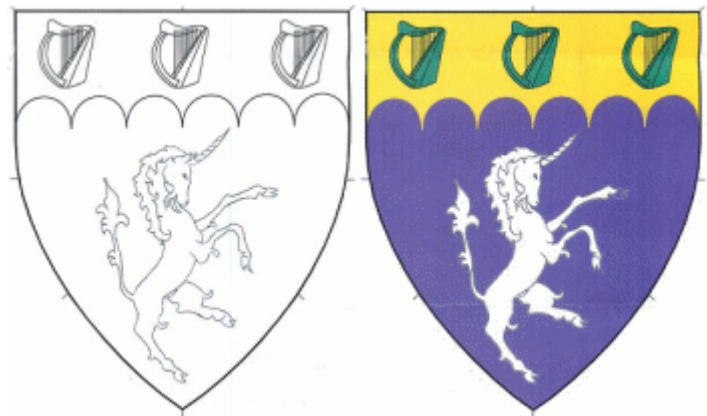
Purpure, a unicorn rampant contourny argent and on a chief engrailed Or three harps vert

Maureen - Submitter's given name. Driver's license has been provided.

Abhainn Ciach Ghlais - Group name, registered 1989 via the East.

This design is marginally over-complex - I count 7 on the complexity scale.

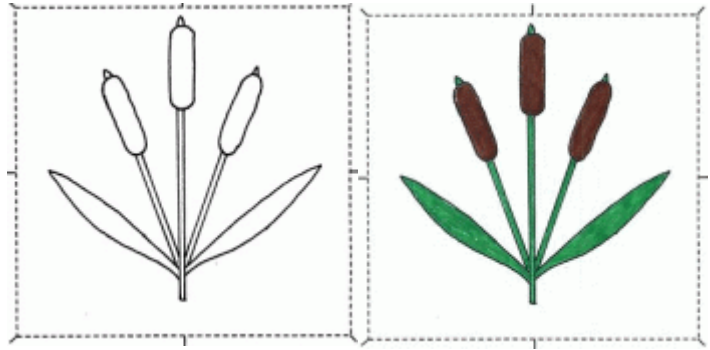
9: Saint Swithin's Bog, Barony of - New Badge

OSCAR finds the name registered exactly as it appears in October of 1999, via Æthelmearc.

(Fieldless) A stand of three cattails slipped and leaved proper

This intended as a populace badge

**10: Sorcha McKenzie - New Name & New Device**

Per fess azure and sable, a phoenix and in chief a heart sustained by a pair of hands fesswise aversant argent

Submitter desires a feminine name.

No major changes.

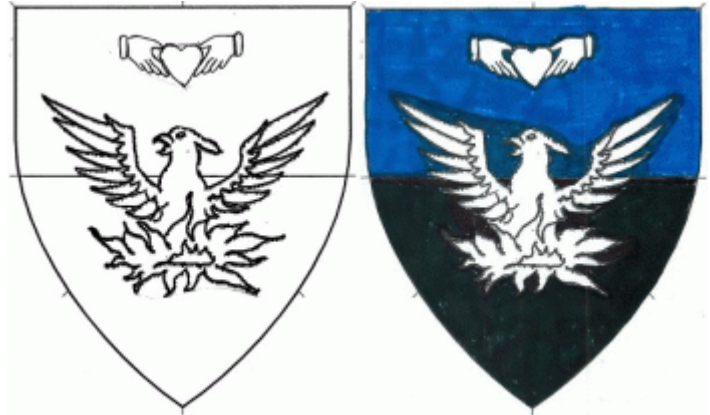
Culture (Scots) most important.

Sorcha - Kathleen M. O'Brien (Mari Elspeth nice Bryan), *Index of Names in Irish Annals: Sorcha*, <<http://medievalscotland.org/kmo/AnnalsIndex/Feminine/Sorcha.shtml>> cites this name to the 15th - 16th c.

McKenzie - Black, p. 525-526, sub MacKenzie, says that a "*Johannes McKenzie*, apprentice of Apilrocem, had a charter of the lands of Kildin with the mill in 1606."

The Table of Lingual Weirdness Rulings <http://www.ellipsis.cx/~liana/sca/weirdness_table.html> cites Gaelic-Scots combinations as one weirdness.
